INVESTIGATIONS AND REGULATORY LAW

Acting for the ACCC in an investigation and subsequent Federal Court proceeding concerning alleged cartel conduct. Led by Nicholas De Young KC, with Katherine Brazenor and Patrick O'Bryan Gusah. Instructed by AGS (ongoing).

Fidge v Pfizer Australia Pty Ltd [\[2024\] FCA 161](#): claim to obtain an injunction against Pfizer in relation to its Covid-19 vaccines and the licence requirements under the *Gene Technology Act 2000* (Cth). Claim summarily dismissed. Led by Bernard Quinn KC. Instructed by DLA Piper.

ACCC v Mazda Australia Pty Limited [\[2024\] FCA 83](#): penalty phase of proceeding. Contraventions found concerned allegations of misleading or deceptive conduct. Led by Martin Scott KC. Instructed by Mills Oakley.

GENERAL COMMERCIAL LAW (INCLUDING CONTRACT LAW, PROPERTY LAW, EQUITY AND TRUSTS)

Telstra Corporation Ltd v ProLearn Corporation Pty Ltd and Kytect Pty Ltd [\[2024\] VSCA 23](#): appeal from trial judgment regarding alleged misleading or deceptive conduct including whether Telstra had reasonable grounds for the alleged misrepresentations. Appeal allowed. High Court special leave application refused. Led by Nicholas De Young KC. Instructed by King & Wood Mallesons.

Online Investments Pty Ltd & Ors v CEG Direct Securities Pty Ltd & Ors [\[2023\] VSC 641](#): resisted summary judgment application on behalf of mortgagee in relation to actions taken by mortgagee when exercising its powers of sale following a loan default. Unled. Instructed by Ronayne Owens Lawyers.

Angelodemou and anor v Newpac Investment Group Pty Ltd, Supreme Court: dispute about the sale of a commercial property including alleged misrepresentations made about the property and alleged repudiation of the sale contract by purchasers. Claim resolved. Led by Daniel Aghion KC. Instructed by Cornwalls.
