Trina holds a PhD in public law from the University of Cambridge, where she studied as a Cambridge (Australia) Trust and J C Hall Scholar, and a Master of Laws (First Class) from the University of Cambridge, and a Bachelor of Arts and Law (First Class) from the University of Melbourne. She was ranked first for the LLB subjects Employment Law, Evidence and Proof and Advanced Legal Research, and the LLM subject Legal and Political Philosophy. She has been a Research Fellow and lecturer in constitutional law for the JD program at Melbourne Law School, has taught human rights on the LLM program at the University of Cambridge, and has delivered practical training within government on statutory interpretation.
